Johnnette Benkovic is founding president of Living His Life Abundantly International. A prolific author, she is best known as producer and host of *Women of Grace* on the Eternal Word Television Network.



Father Philip Bochanski served as Courage chaplain in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia for five years. In January 2015, he was appointed Associate Director of Courage International.

Rowena Slusser is a wife, homeschooling mother of two, and a full-time student at Liberty University. She advocates for women like her, who have conceived from sexual trauma, and for children like her, who were conceived in sexual trauma.


